- ►2017 E-rate data for upgrade (bandwidth) progress check
 - ► Projected availability: *August*
 - ► Validation required due to:
 - ► Typical self-reporting errors and
 - ► Potentially misunderstood application questions











- ▶96% of traditional NM public schools are already connected to fiber (prior to E-rate Funding Year 2017 (FY17) upgrade)
 - ► Half of the remaining schools are **estimated** to have upgraded in FY17









Success Stories

Statewide Price Agreements for Internet Access Services (CAT1) usage:

- Cuba District
 - ► Doubled bandwidth (100 mbps to 200 mbps)
 - ► Received major cost savings (\$2,600 less per month, *pre-discount*)
 - ▶ Option to increase up to 500 mbps while still paying less than old rate
- ► New America & El Camino Real Academy Charters
- ▶ Cimarron District & Bookmobile

Revisiting Tracks


Planned Adjustments:








Program Timeline, 2016 - 2018

 - Define the 1 mbps per student goal as "scalable to 1 mbps per student," meaning a public school/district with:
 - An *existing* broadband connection that is currently, or at least capable of, meeting the goal
